(Standard)

- Fill out Bird Carcass Tag and attach to bird's leg.
- Notify Game and Parks Commission

**\*\*If not available, leave a message. Your message qualifies as a contact. Contact should be made within 24 hours of a discovery on a regular business day. On weekends or holidays contact should be made within the 24 hours following the holiday or weekend.**
- Fill out Raptor Electrocutation Report (Specimen # on carcass tag and number on report should be the same) and mail or email to Jeanine Lackey USF&WS. Report should be submitted within 48 hours of initial contact.
- For injured raptors contact Raptor Recovery Nebraska or the Nebraska Game and Parks Commission.

# Raptor Electrocution Procedures

## Checklist

(Transporting Bird)

- Fill out Bird Carcass Tag and attach to bird's leg.
- Notify Game and Parks Commission

Notify US Fish & Wildlife Service  
Jeanine Lackey  
**\*\*If not available, leave a message. Your message qualifies as a contact. Contact should be made within 24 hours of a discovery on a regular business day. On weekends or holidays contact should be made within the 24 hours following the holiday or weekend.**
- Fill out Raptor Mortality Report (Specimen # on carcass tag and number on report should be the same) and mail or email to Jeanine Lackey, USF&WS. Report should be submitted within 48 hours of initial contact.
- If possible place carcass in bag, box or other container.
- Transport carcass when you leave the job site.
- If transporting the carcass is not feasible, before leaving location make arrangements with a Nebraska Game and Parks Commission official at the closest Game and Parks District office.
- If possible freeze or keep the carcass cool while utility is in possession of carcass.
- Notification should be made prior to transporting bird, but if not possible contact Game and Parks or Fish and Wildlife Service within 24 hours on a regular business day or within 24 hours following a weekend or holiday.
- For injured raptors contact Raptor Recovery Nebraska or the Nebraska Game and Parks Commission.
